

# Port of BRIDGEPORT

Opening the Door to the Long Island Sound & Beyond



Tucked into the northern shore of the Long Island Sound, Bridgeport features two natural harbors with easy access to coastal communities in Connecticut and New York. Conveniently located near I-95, Connecticut Routes 25 and 8,

as well as Sikorsky Memorial Airport, it's easy to move your goods across New England, the Northeast, and the Mid-Atlantic.

With state-of-the-art refrigeration, Bridgeport is the ideal gateway for produce and food products. The Bridgeport Regional Maritime Complex also offers easy access to the MetroNorth Commuter Railroad and the Bridgeport-Port Jefferson Ferry, which offers year-round service between Connecticut and New York. Significant improvements to the shipyard resulted in 3 separate buildings with over 100,000 square feet of assembly and fabrication space.



## Bridgeport at a Glance

- Two Main Berths along the Bridgeport Harbor and Black Rock Harbor
  - Water depth of 33' MLW
  - Approach depths of 27' MLW (to be increased to 35' MLW with dredging)
- Pier loading and unloading
  - 40 pieces of electric forklift equipment specially designed for cargo in refrigerated ships and warehouses
  - 20 additional pieces of forklift equipment with 20 ton capacity
  - Shore crane with 110 ton capacity
- Convenient storage
  - 130,000 square feet of dry, interior storage
  - 85,000 square feet of refrigerated warehouse space, with temperature capability to 32° F, certified by USDA for Cold Treatment
- Expert handling of bananas, plantains, apples, pears, citrus, melons, assorted produce, forest products, containers, automobiles, minerals and chemicals, optical and medical equipment, apparel, plastics, glass, nuclear machinery, gems and precious stones, rubber products, and general breakbulk cargo
