Chair Paul Whitescarver called the Annual Public Hearing to order at 11:00am.

2. Connecticut Port Authority Presentation

Executive Director Michael O’Connor provided a presentation that included a review of 2025 and an overview of priorities for 2026. For the 2025 review, he noted updates to staffing; marketing and communications efforts; engagement with shoreline partners; sponsorship of the CT Maritime Heritage Festival; Small Harbor Improvement Projects Program (SHIPPP); ongoing activities including New London State Pier operations, federal grant application for Groton Fuel Terminal, implementation of EPA Clean Ports grant, commercial fisherman leases for dock space at State Pier and Fort Trumbull Pier 7; and dredging updates including the completion of maintenance

dredging in New Haven Harbor, maintenance dredging of Stony Creek in Branford, New Haven channel work in 2026/2027, and dredging in Bridgeport (2029) and Black Rock (2030); planning for future dredging management; and U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) Planning Assistance to States study that continues to progress. He noted priorities for 2026 including dredging, logistics and freight opportunities, federal grants, SHIPP, engagement and future activities at New London State Pier.
